Brendan likes to compare his interior design studio to the United Nations – “we appreciate that things can have a different background but can live together harmoniously”. To that end he draws on various international influences with the stipulation that pieces have to work in their own right. “Clients come to us because we can find unique and limited-edition pieces,” he says. Brendan uses good-quality, well-detailed materials that are layered with furniture and art to evoke restrained luxury. “I like the link between architecture and interiors to be subtle,” he says.
